Aspen Surgery Centre:

Launched in June, 2012, the multi-disciplinary Aspen Medical Surgery Centre is a first of its kind in Saskatchewan. The Centre's talented team of close to 30 caregivers (surgeons, doctors, nurses and support staff) provide world-class patient care, supported by clinic infrastructure that is equal-to, or exceeds offerings in major clinics and hospitals. With more than 4,200 square feet of clinical and surgical space, the centre can accommodate up to 20 patients per day (without utilizing weekends or double shifts).

The Centre boasts two licensed and approved operating theatres, two procedure/exam rooms, five post-surgery recovery beds, and two reclining chair recovery positions. Dr. Al Beggs, the Centre's Medical Director, ensures that healthcare and service standards are not only met, but are exceeded in an environment that ensures confidentiality, privacy, safety and professionalism. The Surgery Centre's qualified professional are able to effectively manage the following:

- A patient's journey from initial contact through to completion of surgery and first follow-up appointment

NOTEWORTHY PROJECTS

Aspen medical has led hundreds of major projects worldwide. Included is a sampling of the projects that company has been involved with.

Surgical Wait Times

Aspen Medical has an internationally proven capability in the area of waiting list surgery. It has undertaken several major projects in surgical waiting list reductions; one in England, several in Northern Ireland and the remainder in Australia. Aspen Medical's operational model is based upon utilising external staff to supplement current incumbents with additional of staff (i.e. we bring additional surgical capacity in to the region without stripping out surgical capacity from other public health regions) whilst allowing existing surgical teams to conduct their current workload during the program. The process for our projects involves the current administration staff scheduling all outpatient preoperative consultations and then scheduling theatre appointments and post-operative reviews.

The project in England was run across seven sites and consisted of orthopedic and some general surgery. The Northern Ireland program was conducted at one site and provided ophthalmology and urology surgery. The Australian program were conducted in Canberra, across New South Wales and the Northern Territory.

All the projects were based upon using external staff to support local staff with the emphasis being on health professional 'additionality,' and allowing current providers to maintain their ongoing work throughput. Aspen provided the nurses, surgeons, anesthetists, project managers and, in some cases, the company also provided the operating theatre and ward as well. As part of the overall patient pathway, Aspen Medical managed the pre-operative and post-operative consultations which were provided in addition to the surgery.

Project deliverables include:

- Cleared 5,000 major orthopaedic and 7,000 minor orthopaedic surgery cases at seven sites in 12 months in UK.
- Cleared a two years waiting list in ophthalmic surgery in two weeks, and an eight year waiting list in urology surgery in three months in Northern Ireland.

Military

Puckapunyal Military Area

The Puckapunyal Military Area (PMA) is a major Australian Army training base situated near Seymour, Victoria, 100km north of Melbourne. The PMA covers an area of some 50,000 hectares. Within the PMA, the Puckapunyal Training Area (PTA), comprises of 43,850 hectares, and is used for the complete scope of live firing and field activities.

The PMA has a permanent population of around 1,100 Australian Defence Force (ADF) personnel. Approximately 50,000 students, range users and visitors also visit the PMA each year. Since 2005, Aspen Medical has been contracted to provide all health services at the PMA. Puckapunyal is one of only two ADF sites in Australia where the complete health services are contracted out to a civilian contractor. Aspen Medical provides or manages all health services, from primary care, to diagnostics (pathology and radiology), allied health (such as pharmacy and physiotherapy), rehabilitation and secondary care.

Albury Wodonga Military Area

The Albury Wodonga Military Area (AWMA) is situated in the area of two main Australian Army Bases with the primary focus being training of Army personnel. The Army Logistics Training Centre (ALTC) is the largest unit. Approximately 506 Australian Defence Force (ADF) and Australian Public Service personnel are permanently located within the AWMA with approximately 6000 trainees attending courses throughout the year.

Aspen Medical was contracted by the Australian Department of Defence for the provision of all health services at AWMA. Albury Wodonga is one of only two ADF sites in Australia where the complete health services are contracted out to a civilian contractor. Aspen Medical provides or manages all health services, from primary care, to diagnostics (pathology and radiology), allied health (such as pharmacy and physiotherapy), rehabilitation and secondary care.

Aspen Medical has recently signed an extension with the Australian Department of Defence on the contract at the AWMA until June 2012, with options for extensions for a further two years other Government aid.

Aboriginal

The Expanding Health Service Delivery Initiative (EHSDI) is part of a joint initiative between the Australian Government and Northern Territory Government to progress both Governments' Closing the Gap policies and address Aboriginal disadvantage, with substantial funding allocated to improve access to health services.

A major area of the initiative was the establishment of the Remote Area Health Corps (RAHC), a company that could recruit and provide additional health professionals to expand the delivery of primary health care services in remote Northern Territory Aboriginal communities.

In late 2008, Aspen Medical was contracted by the Office for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Health (OATSIH) of the Department of Health and Ageing (DoHA) to establish and manage RAHC. RAHC recruits and supports urban-based health professionals – doctors, nurses, dental and allied health - to work in primary health services for Aboriginal people in remote areas of the Northern Territory. Assignments are paid and for short periods of three



weeks to three months enabling health professionals to maintain their professional and personal obligations at home while participating in efforts to improve Aboriginal health.

Project Deliverables Include:

- RAHC has facilitated more than 880 health professional placements in remote communities in the Northern Territory
- Provided more than 3145 weeks of additional health service in the region.

Emergency in Emergency Room

The Modbury and Queen Elizabeth Hospitals are two of the largest public hospitals in the South Australian capital of Adelaide. In early 2010, a critical staffing shortage in the Emergency Departments of both hospitals threatened to reduce the available after-hours services causing patients to have to travel great distances for basic accident and emergency care.

Aspen Medical was contracted by the South Australian Health Department to provide medical staff for the short-to-medium term at both hospitals while the Emergency Department's recruitment process for permanent staff is underway. This enabled the Emergency Departments to stay open, offering a full range of services to the local community.

Project Deliverables Include:

- Aspen Medical staff covered shifts in both emergency departments assisting the continuation of 24 hour emergency coverage.
- Provided Emergency department with doctors to cover medical vacancies.

Cholera Outbreak

In September 2009, a deadly Cholera outbreak began on the mainland of Papua New Guinea (PNG). By 2010, this outbreak had spread through to the Western Province of the country killing many local residents and affecting thousands more. AusAid began monitoring the situation and after meeting with the World Health Organization decided to undertake a joint mission to the region to address ways to prevent the further spread of the disease.

The project Aspen Medical was contracted by AusAID to assist the Cholera Emergency Response Committee for the Western Province of PNG in their efforts to contain the severe Cholera outbreak sweeping through remote areas of the country.

Project Deliverables Include:

- Technical advice on water and sanitation measures for the immediate emergency response on the island of Daru.
- Advice to help prevent the further spread of Cholera by identifying the factors that were contributing to the outbreak in the region.
